What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Income Fund¹ has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Forsyth Barr Investment Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund aims to pay distributions, while maintaining the fund's capital value over the long-term by selecting a mix of cash, fixed interest, equity and property investments. Investors can expect moderate to high levels of movement up and down in value and to receive longer-term returns that are generally higher than term deposit rates of domestic major banks (but with more risk) and are lower than those of the Growth Fund (but with less risk).

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator² for the Income Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.


How has the fund performed?


Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Jane had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jane received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$661 (that is 6.61% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Jane a total return after tax of \$509 for the year.

The top 10 investments make up 39.07% of the fund.

Foreign currency exposures associated with international fixed interest are hedged to the New Zealand dollar. We actively manage the fund's foreign currency exposures associated with international and Australian equities, and listed property. As at 31 December 2023, these exposures represented 20.33% of the value of the fund. After allowing for foreign currency hedges in place, 12.39% of the value of the fund was unhedged and exposed to foreign currency risk.
